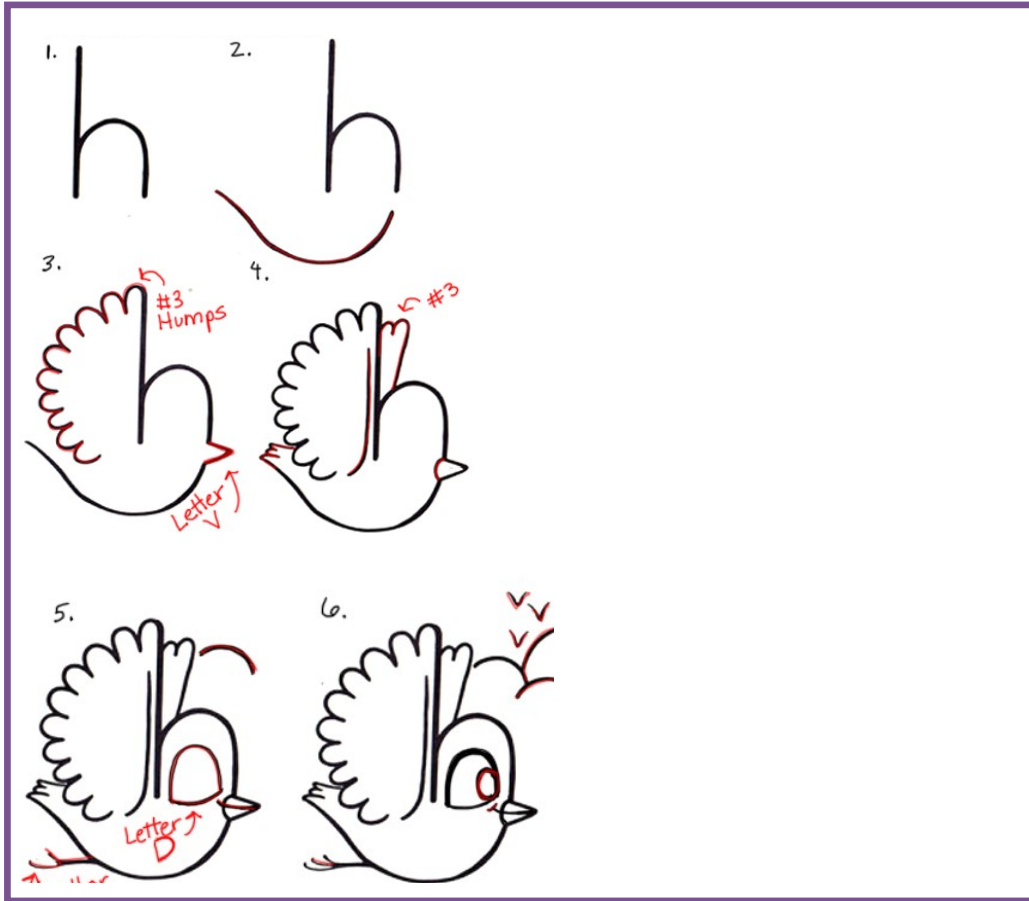


Like a Bird

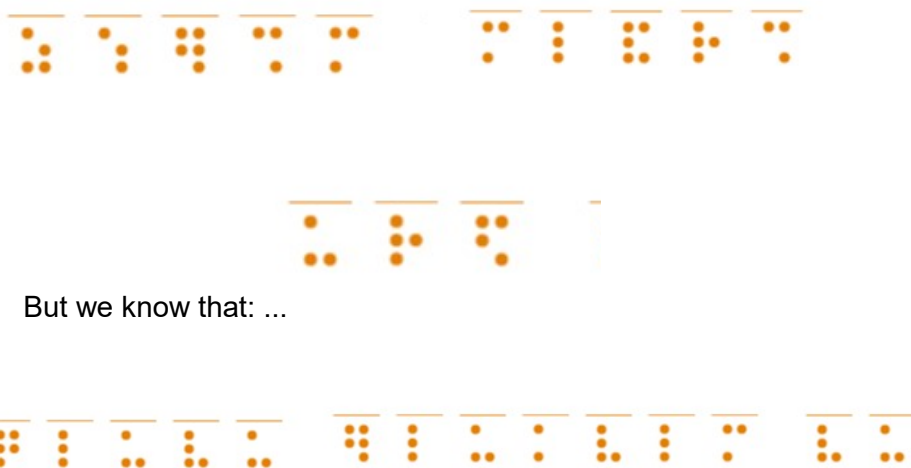

What's a Pilgrim Song?

Over the next few weeks, we are going to be learning about the Psalms of Ascent or Pilgrim Songs. But what does that mean?

A **pilgrim** is someone who goes on an adventure or journey.

Ascent means the act of rising or going upward.

These Psalms are a collection of songs that would have been sung while the people were on their way up to the Temple. In that time the Temple was where God lived with the people.

Remembering What God Did

Some psalms sung on the way to the Temple were meant to remember what God did for Israel. In this week's Pilgrim Song, we are reminded of how God brought Israel out of slavery in Egypt.

God opened up the Red Sea for the people to cross over, but when Pharaoh tried to cross the sea fell on top of him and the Egyptians.
